

## CHRISTINE HOCHMUTH

Christine Hochmuth is a Science and Technology Fellow with the California State Senate Transportation and Housing Committee. During the fellowship year, Ms. Hochmuth serves as a consultant to the committee and will work on various topics, including pavement sustainability, rules of the road, mobilehome and manufactured housing and parks, and legislation involving the active transportation program.

Prior to starting the fellowship, Ms. Hochmuth was a post-doctoral fellow at UC San Diego studying the development of blood stem cells. She also taught introductory biology at the University of San Diego. She received her Ph.D. from the University of Rochester in New York, where she researched the mechanisms that control intestinal stem cells. Ms. Hochmuth received her B.S. and M.S. from the State University of New York at Brockport as a Distinguished Scholar-in-Residence.
