

REAL ID: Frequently Asked Questions

What does a REAL ID card look like? How can I tell if my identification card is compliant?

Most REAL ID compliant licenses are marked with a star in the upper portion of the card. If you do not see a star or are unsure, visit your state driver's license agency website for additional details about your state's REAL ID license and identification card.

How do I know if my state is REAL ID compliant?

To find out if your state is REAL ID compliant, please visit the Department of Homeland Security's Official REAL ID webpage www.dhs.gov/real-id.

Why do I need a REAL ID? States will *not* require a REAL IDcompliant license to drive or vote, but you will need it to board commercial aircraft effective October 1, 2020.

Will any other forms of • identification be accepted?

If you do not have a REAL ID-compliant identification card, U.S. passports, DHS Trusted Traveler cards and military identification will also be accepted at the TSA checkpoint. For a complete list of IDs that fly, visit www.tsa.gov/real-id.

Do I need a REAL ID if I have TSA • PreCheck?

Yes. Although TSA PreCheck is a great benefit, you will still need to present a REAL ID compliant ID to pass through a TSA security checkpoint.

Do my kids need a REAL ID to • travel?

No. Only air travelers 18 years of age and older will be required to present a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or another form of approved identification to fly within the United States.

Is REAL ID really going to be • enforced? Will TSA extend the deadline again?

TSA is fully prepared to implement • the REAL ID Act in October 1, 2020. We encourage you to visit your state's Department of Motor Vehicles and be prepared as early as possible.

Changes are coming to airport security requirements

Effective Oct. 1, 2020, travelers will not be allowed to board a flight without a REAL ID or an approved alternative identification such as a passport – even for domestic flights.

Travelers who prefer using a driver's license as a primary form of identification at the airport will need to ensure they have a REAL ID compliant card. Otherwise, travelers may be unable to pass through the checkpoint and board their flight after October 1, 2020.

What does a REAL ID compliant license look like? REAL ID compliant driver's licenses are generally marked with a star in the upper-right portion of the identification card. Below is an image of what REAL ID compliance licenses look like here in [[insert state here]].

Valid passports will also be accepted as a valid form of identification at the TSA checkpoint after October 1, 2020, as well as Traveler Cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST) issued by the Department of Homeland Security. Subject: Don't Miss Your Flight – Important Changes Coming to TSA Checkpoints

Did you know that this time next year TSA will not accept some state issued driver's licenses and identification cards at the security checkpoint?

Effective October 1, 2020, all air travelers over the age of 18 will need a REAL ID compliant driver's license or identification card to pass through security and board commercial flights within the United States. U.S. passports, DHS Trusted Traveler cards and military identification will also be accepted.

How do you know if you have a REAL ID compliant identification card?

Take a moment and look at your state-issued identification card or driver's license. **Does it look like the image below?**

Sample of State/Local — Letter

Dear [Constituent],

I want to ensure you are aware of important new security requirements that will be enforced at all TSA checkpoints next year.

Effective on Oct. 1, 2020, travelers will not be allowed to board a flight without a REAL ID, or some kind of alternative identification such as a passport – even if you are flying within the United States.

What does this mean for you? If you prefer using your driver's license as your primary form of identification at the airport, you will need to ensure you have a REAL ID compliant card. Otherwise, you may be unable to pass through the checkpoint and board your flight after October 1, 2020.

Take a moment to look at your state-issued identification card or driver's license. **Does it look like the image below?** If so, your identification card meets the new security standards. If not, you will need to visit the Department of Motor Vehicle's website for information about obtaining a REAL ID here in *[[state]]*.
